First Reading: Daniel 12: 1-3
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 16
Second Reading: Hebrews 10: 11-

14, 18

Gospel: Mark 13: 24-32



**Key Phrase:** "He will gather his chosen from the four winds."

Mark 13: 27

**Readings:** The prophet Daniel speaks of that future time when time and history will give way to eternity, when just people will be raised up to everlasting life. The Letter to the Hebrews asserts that the sacrifice of Jesus has sanctified humankind once for all. Mark tells us how Jesus describes the final consummation of history speaking of violent upheavals in nature. The future, radical transformation of all life and time is symbolized by catastrophic changes in the heavens and on earth.

Reflection: As always at this time of year, we begin to contemplate the end of the world - a theme that carries us over next Sunday's feast (Christ the King) and so into Advent. Such a contemplation is not gloomy or morbid: throughout the ages (and especially in the early days) Christians have been utterly positive about the coming end of all things, because we know what will happen, and in fact we earnestly desire it to come: the phrase that gives this away is in the Gospel: "Then he will send his angels to gather his chosen from the four winds." This gathering of God's children together will be a truly wonderful event, when we will all be completely enfolded in that love of God that we talk so much about.

**Praying:** Let us pray that our union through the Eucharist may be the sign of that day when Christ will gather His pilgrim Church into His kingdom.
