


# **YMSR Spiritual Retreat**

# Easter 2 Sunday

First Reading: Acts 5: 12-16 Responsorial: 118 Second Reading: Rev. 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19 Gospel John 20:19-31



**KEY VERSES**: "You believe in Me Thomas, because you have seen Me, says the Lord; blessed are they who have not seen me, but still believe. John 20: 29

**READINGS:** The first reading speaks of the success of the early mission of the apostles. The second reading presents images taken from the beginning of the Book of Revelations. The visionary reacts with fear, for he recognizes that he is in the presence of something very holy something that is beyond his understanding. The Gospel presents two encounters with the risen Jesus. The first when Jesus appears to the disciples on the evening of Easter. The second accounts concern Thomas who did not believe of Christ's visitation. The accounts are to state the purpose for the writing of the Gospel; it is that we believe that Jesus is the Son of God.

**REFLECTING:** This week the Gospel is chosen because it relates "what happened today" - eight days after Easter, Jesus comes again to his disciples. The story of Thomas's doubt and faith leads us to think about our doubts and faith - but always in the context of being part of the family of the Church. Remember last week, and the renewal of your own baptismal promises on Holy Saturday: "this is the faith of the Church, the faith in which we are baptized."

**PRAYING:** Heavenly Father, help us to imitate Your Son in our concern for others. So that we may be a sign of Your love to all who meet us.
