SIR 3:2-6, 12-14

A reading from the Book of Sirach.

#### SECOND READING

COL 3:12-21

A reading from the Letter to the Colossians.

Beloved: Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do. And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts,

the peace into which you were also called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Wives, be subordinate to your husbands, as is proper in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives, and avoid any bitterness toward them. Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord. GOSPEL LK 2:41-52

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.

### **FAITH SHARING**

On this Feast day of the Holy Family we are offering our own families and all their members on the altar to ask God's blessing on them and to obtain for them the guidance of the Holy Family. The Book of Sirach, where our <u>first reading</u> comes from, gets to the heart of biblical understanding of the family and the wisdom of God's plan. It takes the 4th Commandment (Honor your father and mother) to higher level, explaining how this principle is foundational for a moral life, a life that ultimately honors God.

In the <u>second reading</u>, Paul invites us to put on clothes which are not made of natural fibers. They are woven of spiritual stuff. Try as you might in your own power to create them, you need God to create them.

In today's Gospel, Luke concludes his detailed story of Christ's infancy, with the events of Jesus' visit to the Temple in Jerusalem at the age of twelve to become "a son of the Law" [bar mitzvah] and take up the obligations of the Law. Jesus lingered behind in the Temple, attending the Sanhedrin classes on religious and theological questions as an eager student of Mosaic Law. Finally, when Mary and Joseph had found him in the Temple after three days of anxious search, the Gospel then summarizes the next 18 years of Jesus' life, stating that Jesus grew up at Nazareth like any other young man, obeying his parents, faithfully discharging all his duties to God, to his parents, and to the community, "advancing in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.

## LIFE MESSAGE

The Church encourages us to look to the Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph for inspiration, example and encouragement. Each family is called to holiness. By the Sacrament of Matrimony Jesus sanctifies not only the spouses but also the entire family. The husband and wife attain holiness when they discharge their duties faithfully, trusting in God, and drawing on the power of God by prayer.

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Raise

your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you: your sons come from afar, and your daughters in the arms of their nurses. Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you. Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Midian and Ephah; all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the LORD. The Word of the Lord.

It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. GOSPEL MT 2:1-12

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew.

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way. ## TAKE POINSETTIAS AND LUMINARIA HOME

This Sunday after Mass or the next Sunday you can take your donated poinsetias and luminaria home.

### **MEANING OF C+M+B:**

- 1. **Christus Mansionem Benedicat**: This Latin phrase translates to "May Christ bless this house," signifying a prayer for God's blessing on the home and its inhabitants.
- 2. Caspar, Melchior, Balthasar: The letters also represent the traditional names of the Magi Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar who visited the Christ Child. They reflect the universal nature of Christ's mission, as the Magi came from distant lands to worship Him.

## The Inscription:

During Epiphany (Jan 6 or the closest Sunday), the initials are written above doorways using blessed chalk in a specific format: 20 + C + M + B + 25

The 20 and 25 signify the current year. The + signs represent crosses, symbolizing Christ's presence and protection. C, M, B stand for both the Magi's names and the Latin blessing.
