#### 2019 Discipleship Baptism

Baptism is the way we become members of the church, the body of Christ or family of God. It is a sign of everything God has promised us — new life in Jesus, forgiveness of sin, and the coming of a new creation. When Jesus was baptized, the Holy Spirit rested on him like a bird from heaven, and God said: "You are my beloved child." God says the same thing to us when we are baptized.

Everyone who is baptized in our National Catholic Church is a kind of minister, a disciple — called to live like Jesus, to love others, and to serve God. We are part of that royal priesthood found in Sacred Scriptures. Each one of us is given special gifts from the Holy Spirit to help us do these things. When we remember our baptism, we give thanks for these gifts and this calling, and we promise again to follow Jesus in everything we do.

#### **Directory for Worship**

Response to the Word also involves acts of discipleship but also of commitment and recognition. The Sacrament of Baptism is that of initiation. which should be observed. In our Church, baptized believers are received as members of the church as they make public their profession of faith for the first time, or as they reaffirm that faith through confirmation. Therefore, sponsors or godparents must be baptized and be members in good standing in the Church. In our case, a National Catholic or one of Catholic tradition. It is also appropriate to offer opportunities for individuals to engage in reaffirming the commitments made at Baptism with the recitation of the Nicene Creed during Holy Mass.

Other acts of discipleship and commitment which may appropriately be included as response to the Word are;

- Christian marriage
- ordination and installation of church officers.
- commissioning for service in and to the church in such roles as Christian educator, church school teacher, organizational officer, or group adviser

This means we shift from a saving relationship of me-and-God to the saving relationship of us-and-God.

## **Baptism of the Lord**

First Reading: Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11 Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 104

**Second Reading:** Titus 2: 11-14; 3:4-7

**Gospel**: Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22



**KEY VERSE:** ""While Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened." Luke 3: 21

**READING:** It was God Himself who would intervene for God loved the people of Israel from our first reading. Paul wrote that we must live what Baptism signifies. We must reject those things which opposed to the truth and live Spirit-filled lives of virtue. The Gospel gives us the revelation of who Jesus truly is, the Messiah, the Son of God.

**REFLECTING:** We have followed the Feasts of Christmas; of the Holy Family and especially Epiphany and have seen these seasons in terms of the growing manifestation or appearing of the Son of God: first to the shepherds and then to the wise men from the East. Now in the River Jordan, Jesus, Son of Mary, is revealed to all as the fullness of all God's promises: "This is my Son, the Beloved". On this day we stand before the revelation of God's love for us, such that he would send his only Son into the world. Christmas without the Baptism of the Lord, and the words that are spoken from heaven, would be incomplete, since it is only in them that we fully see the wonder of what happened in Bethlehem. We look forward to hearing the Gospels in Ordinary Time, we do so having been shown who it is we listen to: the only Son of God, the Beloved.

**PRAYING:** Father, may we keep true to our baptismal and confirmation vows of being true witnesses and disciples of Jesus. This we pray through Christ Jesus our Lord who lives and reigns forever and ever.
