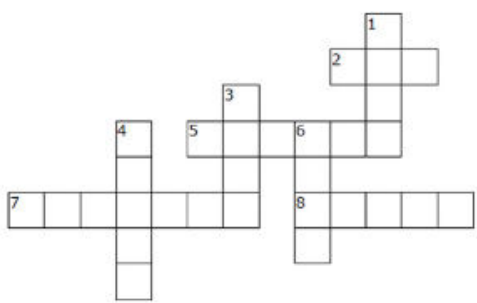

FAITH SHARING

The Baptism of the Lord is the great event that marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

In the first reading Isaiah says that God has told him to tell the exiled citizens of Jerusalem that their "sentence" is at an end, that their exile is over! Isaiah reminds them plainly that the Exile was a punishment for their sins, but that the merciful God has forgiven them.

In the second reading we hear of a Gentile named Cornelius. He was a centurion in the Roman military and also a proselyte, someone who was not of the bloodline of Abraham who had converted to Jewish faith. He saw a



vision of an angel coming to him, directing him to send for Peter. Cornelius immediately sent some trusted people to go and fetch Peter.

In the Gospel, God's words, "*This is my beloved Son,*", confirmed Jesus' identity as God's Son, and the words "*with whom I am well pleased,*" pointed to Jesus' mission of atoning for the sins of the world by His suffering

and death on the cross. The Holy Spirit equipped Jesus by descending on him in the form of dove, giving him the power of preaching and healing.

LIFE MESSAGE

Neither John nor Jesus invented baptism. It had been practiced for centuries among the Jews as a ritual equivalent to our Confession. Until the fall of the



Temple in 70 AD, it was common for Jewish people to use a special pool called a *Mikveh* — literally a "collection of water" — as a means of spiritual cleansing, to remove spiritual impurity and sin. Men took this bath weekly on the eve of the Sabbath; women, monthly. Converts were also expected to take this bath before entering Judaism. The Orthodox Jews still retain the rite. John preached that such a bath was a necessary preparation for the cataclysm that would be

wrought by the coming Messiah. Jesus transformed this continuing ritual into the one single, definitive act by which we begin our life of Faith. In effect, He fused His Divine Essence with the water and the ceremony.
