Solemnity-Christ the King



First Reading: Daniel 7: 13-14

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 93

Second Reading: Revelations 1: 5-8

Gospel: John 18: 33-37

Key Phrase: “Are you the King of the Jews?” John18: 33c

Readings: Daniel uses a term, son of man, which Christ will make His own. Daniel sees his king ruling over all people, for all time, by the power of the Father. As John begins the Book of Revelations, he composes a hymn of praise to Jesus Christ who won His kingship through His death and who by redeeming us made us a royal nation in the service of the Father. The Gospel gives us the famous scene where Christ declared His kingship before Pilate. Jesus is giving testimony to the Father before the world. This is His whole purpose of existence. Jesus explains this to Pilate, leaving him the option of a choice; Jesus forces no one.

Reflection: Every time we complete the cycle of the liturgical year, there is a seamless blending into the new year: so, just as this week we hear of the King who is to come, next week, we begin a New Year and the Season of Advent by more meditation on the end of time, and the One who is to come again, as he once came among us. This feast affirms that Christ is King, that he is Judge, that he is Ruler of the kings of the earth. By his own words we know that this is true, as he stands before Pilate and says, “Yes, I am a king. But his kingship is different: it is not of the same kind as earthly kings, whose empires fade and pass away. His kingship is eternal, and holy until the end of time. Through his love for us, we share in this sovereignty - this holiness - as priests and kings who “serve his God and Father”. We end our year in simple, awe-filled praise of the One who is, who was, and who is to come - the Almighty. Alleluia! Amen!

Praying Eternal Father, let us pray that we make the right choice in following Jesus, the Eternal King as we conclude this ecclesiastical year, thankful that we are loved as the Children of God. This we pray through Christ our Lord.
