Candle Lighting

Tonight we light all the candles. The **first candle** is the hope shining for those worn thin by times of waiting. The **second candle** is the hope shining for those worn down with wearied souls. The **third candle** captures the hopeful expectation of those eagerly watching for God's glory in our day. The **fourth candle** is the hope of a new tomorrow shining for those seeking freedom from the wounds of this world. Tonight, we light the **Christ candle**. This candle radiates the hope of Jesus Christ to all who are willing to receive it.

He came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him. But to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to those who believe in his name, who were born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God. FAITH SHARING

Is Christmas the greatest feast celebrated in the Church? The answer is no. Easter is the number one feast, Pentecost is number two, and Christmas is in the third place. The Catholic Church started celebrating Christmas only after Christianity was recognized as the state religion. December 25th was fixed by Pope Julius in A.D. 353 as a part of baptizing or Christianizing pagan feasts so that the converted pagans might celebrate the birthday of Jesus on Dec 25th instead of celebrating the birthday the Sun-god during winter solstice, so that converted Roman soldiers might celebrate Christmas instead the birthday of Mithras, the Roman god-of-virility (*Deus Solus Invictus*). The Romans called

their winter holiday *Saturnalia*, honoring the god of agriculture, Saturn. Later the *Kalends* of January were observed to celebrate the triumph of life over death. The entire season was called *Dies Natalis Invicti Solis*, the *Birthday of the Unconquered Sun* (or *Saturnalia*). It was Emperor Julianus who declared Christmas as a national holiday in the 6th century.



Most of the present-day Christmas decorations like

the Christmas carols and gifts, Christmas tree and Christmas lights are also remnants of the pagan celebrations. It was St. Francis of Assisi who first introduced the manger or Christmas crib in the 13th century.



LIFE MESSAGE

God undertook the Incarnation of Jesus as True God and true man to save us from the bondage of sin. We call our celebration of the Incarnation of God in a Baby today "*Good News*" because our Divine Savior has been born. As our Savior, Jesus liberated us from slavery to sin and atoned for our sins by his suffering, death and Resurrection. So, every Christmas reminds us that we need a Savior every day, to free us from our evil addictions and unjust, impure and uncharitable tendencies. Christmas 2024 also challenges us to accept Jesus in the manger as our saving God and personal Savior and to surrender our lives to him, allowing him to rule our hearts and lives every day in 2025, the coming New Year. Christmas is the feast of the Emmanuel because God in the New Testament is a God Who continues to live with us in all the events of our lives. As Emmanuel, Jesus lives in the Sacraments, in the Bible, in the praying community, and in each believer. Christmas reminds us that we are bearers of God with the missionary privilege and duty of conveying Jesus to those around us by loving them as Jesus did, through sacrificial and humble service. Sharing with others Jesus, the Emmanuel, is the best Christmas gift we can give, or receive, today.
