# SOLEMNITY BROTHERLY LOVE

**First Reading:** Jeremiah 31: 31-34

**Responsorial Psalm:** 136

**Second Reading:** 1 John 4: 17-21

**Gospel:** Luke 10: 25-37



**KEY VERSE:** “Then go and do the same”

Luke 10:37

**READINGS:** Jeremiah and other prophets proclaim that God’s people can rejoice and praise God for his promises, as they had broken the covenant, but God in his compassion will not remain angry, and will restore them. From death will rise new life, and also a new way of relating to God. There is no fear in perfect or pure love. This is the thought of John here. John was a very peculiar writer. He was not a reasoner like the Apostle Paul. Paul delighted to run off in long chains of logic. John was an intuitive man; he stood face to face with truth, and he declared it. He was very much like his Lord and Master. Jesus and the Lawyer. The precise motive behind the Lawyer’s question isn’t clear. It’s the question that matters. “Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” The question itself contradicts the core of Jesus’ teaching because the inheritance of any form is the result of a relationship. Love God and love your neighbor.

**REFLECTING:** Would I be like the Good Samaritan and sacrifice my time and money to help someone in need or would I only be concerned for myself? Most people would not, especially in this society that thinks only of themselves. May we reflect upon the Scripture Lessons presented today on this solemnity. The Church and our parish would greatly benefit.

**PRAYING:** Heavenly Father, teach me to love you and my neighbor. May I always be true to the calling of my discipleship founded upon the love You have given me share. This I pray through Jesus Christ my Lord and Savior.
