

Something to Think About

Keep in mind that the Body of Christ is faith, and the Blood of Christ is love. Therefore, to take Communion worthily (1 Corinthians 11:27) does not mean only that you must be free from mortal sin and able to receive graces in pure faith. It also means that you must be willing to "pay the price" of receiving Christ within you. And what is that price? It is the willingness to make the personal sacrifice of shedding your own blood—that is, to stop defending your pride and personal pleasure—so as to love others according to the Way of the Cross, in perfect sacrifice. Only in this way can you receive Christ's love worthily.

First Reading: Amos 6: 1a, 4-7

Responsorial Psalm: 146

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6: 11-16

Gospel: Luke 16: 19-31



KEY VERSE: "Good things came your way; just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony."

Luke 16: 25

READINGS: In our first reading, Amos speaks to the wealthy of Judah and Israel. Their crime is that they could not care less for the plight of the poor. Besides, their conduct will bring ruin on the whole nation. Paul writes that as Jesus was faithful to His call in the face of hostility that led to his death, so Christians facing persecution should be faithful to God's call. The Gospel contains Jesus' famous parable of the rich man and the beggar man, the also the consequences.

REFLECTING: Following on from last week ("You cannot be the slave of both God and money") we see a practical illustration of what this means. The division between rich and poor was very striking at the time of Jesus: popular understanding, however, said that to be rich was a blessing from God. Jesus reminds people that riches carry their own responsibility - the duty to notice the poor man, especially when he lies at your own gate. In this parable, Jesus is subtly attacking the people's lack of acceptance of the teaching of the prophets "They have Moses and the prophets" ..., but they obviously haven't listened to them. The twist in the last line is powerful: - "they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead." Since our world still sees a division between rich and poor, how true those words have become!

PRAYING: Lord, You taught that whatever we do for the least of our brethren we do to You. Help us never to forget this and to put it into practices in all our dealings with others. We ask this of You who lives and reigns for ever and ever.
