KEY VERSE: "Who is my neighbor?" Luke 10: 29

READINGS: Moses dwells on the word of God as always presents to His people. That word is not far distant from us, but alive and active in each one's conscience. Paul summarizes his beliefs in Christ for the Colossians some who saw Jesus as only one mediator among many. Paul tells them that Jesus is the head of the Church, the one in whom all creation has its being. The parable of the Good Samaritan is a familiar one for us. Jesus not only tells us that we must consider every person our neighbor but that the law of God means nothing if not practiced. The Samaritan understood the meaning of the law better than those who were skilled in its intricacies.

REFLECTING: Both first reading and Gospel today invite us to be "down to earth" about the Law of God. It's very easy to become an "expert in religion" - knowing all the right answers, remembering all the right quotes, and so on. But for Moses and for Jesus, if God's Law is to be kept anywhere, it must be in our hearts and in our everyday lives. We are not to be concerned with keeping our eyes fixed on heaven, if it means that we cannot see the poor man at our feet. Always remember God words, are Spirit and life; It is through this that we have everlasting life.

PRAYING: Merciful Father, You gave Jesus, the model of love, patience and sacrifice. Help us to know and love You better. This we pray through the same Jesus Who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit.
