24TH SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Exodus 32: 7-11; 13-14

Responsorial Psalm: 51

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 12-17

Gospel: Luke 15: 1-32



KEY VERSE: “I say to you that likewise there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine just persons who need no repentance.”
Luke 15: 7

READINGS: In the first reading, the people have stayed from the path of God. Turning their backs on the God that brought them out of slavery, we see Moses interceding for them. Paul teaches that Christ came into the world to save sinners in the second reading. Paul himself experienced the saving mercy of God. Jesus justifies Himself in the Gospel by teaching the pharisees three parables because he is accused of being with sinners.

REFLECTING: The message of God’s forgiveness is one that we are familiar with, but which the Lord still wishes to emphasize. Our human approach to forgiveness is so often flawed - we hold grudges, erect barriers, make demands and establish conditions. Jesus wants to remind his listeners - and us - that God’s forgiveness is overflowing and bountiful. Saint Paul was aware of this: he had persecuted the Church, calling himself “the greatest of sinners”; and yet, thanks to the “inexhaustible patience” of God, he can count himself a believer. We must be open to the gift of forgiveness for ourselves, and as in today’s parable shows us to open to that forgiveness and offer to other whom we would condemn.

PRAYING: Heavenly Father, guide us in Your mercy, for left to ourselves, we cannot please You. This we pray through Christ our Lord.
