Discipleship

If we will follow Jesus, we must worship God — *through* Jesus, because he is our Mediator and Jesus *himself*, because he is God.

This is the fundamental perspective of a disciple because it is more ultimate than anything else, we are or do, and most distinctive in our context. As far as ultimate, worshiping Jesus — gladly reflecting back to him the radiance of his worth — is the greatest act for any creature. As far as context, nothing will irritate our pluralistic society more than being an exclusive worshiper of Jesus. Lots of people are cool with Jesus (at least their notion of him), and even following the “ways” of Jesus, when it leaves out the exclusivity part. Jesus the Moral Teacher, the Nice Guy, the Judge-Not-Lest-You-Be-Judged Motivational Speaker — *that* Jesus is everybody’s homeboy. But that is not the real Jesus. That’s a manmade figure — a far cry from the portrait Jesus gives of himself. To follow Jesus, to be his disciple, doesn’t mean community involvement and the veneer of tolerance. It means, mainly, first and central, to worship him — with joy at the heart. Making disciples of Jesus means gathering his worshipers.

John shows another picture of the Jesus we’re to worship, and this time he is kneeling before his disciples to wash their feet (John 13:5). I know, it doesn’t sound right, especially when we think of him as the object of our exclusive praise. It didn’t sound right to Peter either, until Jesus said, “If I do not wash you, you have no share with me” (John 13:8). But Jesus is a servant. He came to earth not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as the rescue for sinners (Mark 10:45).

5 ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 6: 1-2a, 3: 8

Responsorial: Psalm 138

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 15: 1-11

Gospel: Luke 5: 1-11



KEY VERSE: "They left everything and followed him."

Luke 5: 11

READING: The first reading speaks of the vision Isaiah had at the beginning of his prophetic ministry. The cry "holy, holy, holy" speaks of the incredible holiness of God. Paul preaches the resurrection of Christ as the basis of our faith. This passage also speaks of the many apparitions of Jesus after the resurrection as well as being in awe to be called an apostle. The Gospel gives an accounting of the call to ministry which is in context of the manifestation of the glory of God.

REFLECTING: We hear the call of another prophet this week - Isaiah. This introduces the Gospel, where we see Jesus calling his first disciples to follow him. Notice that the initiative is Jesus' there is no application process or interview procedure! Notice also the way that Jesus calls his disciples in this account - not with words, but with a miracle that is also a parable. It is, in a way, a miraculous "job description": if the disciple trusts completely in the one who calls, then the result will be truly amazing - a huge catch of men and women hungry for God. Simon's simple words "if you say so" give us an example of Christian discipleship: we should leave our own concerns behind, and simply follow the Lord with great trust.

PRAYING: Heavenly Father, as you called Peter, Andrew, James and John to be a part of your ministry, give me the same call for "Here I am" to do your bidding through Your Church to continue Your mission. This I pray through your Son, Jesus.
